

SHS, BA cross country teams fare well

Statesboro High's boys and girls varsity teams each came home with second place trophies Saturday in the Vidalia Invitational Cross Country Meet. Bleckley County was first in both the boys and girls races, while Swainsboro finished third in both events of the 19-team field.

The Blue Devils' Paul Welle, the defending Region 3-AAAA cross country champion, won the boys division with a blistering time of 16:37 in the 5k event. Other top Statesboro finishers were Jordan Jones (fourth, 17:15), Cam Sutcliff (18:24), Jared Kilpatrick (18.48), Steven Harvey (19:03), Jay Brunson (19:57), and Josh Pollak (20:41). Each runner posted their best individual time so far this season.

In the girls varsity race, Statesboro's Morgan VanGorder finished a strong third, with a time of 19:53. Kate Brunson was 10th with a time of 21:46. Rosa Town came in at 22:27, followed by Tiffany Woodard (22:39), Jordan Long (23:17), Kate Handley (23:19), and Lauren Thomas (23:35). The boys team average was 18:03, while the girls turned in a time of 22:01.

In the middle school division, a two-mile race, Statesboro's top finisher was Stuart Bauler in 11th place with a time of 13:09.

The Blue Devils will be in action again on Saturday when they travel to Conyers, Ga., to participate in the Patriot Invitational. This race features some of the best athletes in the state and is usually visited by several college scouts.

Remler took the lead early in the 3.2-mile race and never looked back as he clocked a 19:20 on the warm afternoon to win the 38-runner race. Manack was a steady second on the first loop around the BA campus but fell further behind the Knight runner. Instead, the BA sophomore was slowly challenged by Frederica's Adam Higgins.

On the second and final loop, Higgins hit the dirt road portion of the course in second place but Manack caught and passed him going through the woods, emerging in second. BA eighth-grader Phillip Brunson was hot on Higgins' heels and wound up taking fourth.

Gator runners captured the fifth through eighth spots to help Bulloch win the varsity boys' team title.

The varsity girls race became

anyone's to win with the absence of Bulloch Academy super sophomore Susanna McKee. McKee has been bothered by knee and shin pain during the season and has been given some time off to rest and recuperate before the region and state meets.

Frederica's Katie Macquire took advantage of the situation to shine as she won the 32-runner race, clocking a 23:22. Teammate Haley Watkins took second with a 23:27. Morgan Carr of Trinity Christian School of Dublin was third (24:26), TCS's Sarah Everitt was fourth (24:44) and Jessie Been of Frederica was fifth (25:34). Frederica won the girls' team title.

Eighth grader Laura Minick was Bulloch Academy's highest finisher, taking ninth place with

a 26:50.

The BA junior varsity girls almost had a perfect score in their team meet, having four runners finish in the top five. Erin O'Sullivan won the 36-runner race with a 10:29 on the 1.6-mile course. Emily Morgan was second (10:46), Haley Burke was third (10:46) and Madeline Manack was fourth (11:00).

Frederica's John Stroud won the 33-runner junior varsity boys' race with a blistering 9:16.
